 - Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Ensuring Pay for Our3 Military Act of 2011".

4 SEC. 2. EMERGENCY APPROPRIATION OF FUNDS TO PRO5 VIDE PAY AND ALLOWANCES FOR MEMBERS
6 OF THE ARMED FORCES AND SUPPORTING
7 CIVILIAN AND CONTRACTOR PERSONNEL
8 DURING FUNDING GAP IMPACTING THE DE9 PARTMENT OF DEFENSE OR DEPARTMENT
10 OF HOMELAND SECURITY.

11 (a) Appropriation of Funds for Military Pay 12 AND ALLOWANCES.—During a funding gap impacting the 13 Armed Forces, the Secretary of the Treasury shall make available to the Secretary of Defense (and the Secretary 14 of Homeland Security in the case of the Coast Guard), 15 16 out of any amounts in the general fund of the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, such amounts as the Secretary 17 18 of Defense (and the Secretary of Homeland Security in 19 the case of the Coast Guard) determines to be necessary to continue to provide pay and allowances (without inter-20 21 ruption) to the following:

(1) Members of the Army, Navy, Air Force,
Marine Corps, and Coast Guard, including reserve
components thereof, who perform active service during the funding gap.

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(2) At the discretion of the Secretary of De fense, such civilian personnel of the Department of
 Defense who are providing support to the members
 of the Armed Forces described in paragraph (1) as
 the Secretary considers appropriate.

6 (3) At the discretion of the Secretary of De-7 fense, such personnel of contractors of the Depart-8 ment of Defense who are providing direct support to 9 the members of the Armed Forces described in para-10 graph (1) as the Secretary considers appropriate.

(b) FUNDING GAP DEFINED.—In this section, the
term "funding gap" means any period of time after the
beginning of a fiscal year for which interim or full-year
appropriations for the personnel accounts of the Armed
Forces for that fiscal year have not been enacted.

16 (c) DURATION OF TRANSFER AUTHORITY.—No
17 transfer may be made by the Secretary of the Treasury
18 under subsection (a) after December 31, 2011.

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
