Dear Acting Director Albence:

As you well know, I am a strong supporter of integrity in our immigration system. I am especially concerned that human rights violators have been able to enter the United States through fraud and misrepresentation and safely settle in this country as if they had never committed such heinous crimes. Human rights violators represent a population of migrants who have committed atrocities, and they must be rooted out and removed.

I became aware of the recent Operation No Safe Haven V, which was spearheaded by the ICE National Fugitive Operations Program and ICE Office of the Principle Legal Advisor. We would like to better understand the origin of the operation, liaison efforts, and generally how these human rights violators are identified, arrested, and removed.

Please provide a briefing to my staff on or before November 6, 2019 regarding:

- 1. The total number of human rights violators arrested and deported under all No Safe Haven operations.
- 2. Atrocities committed by these human rights violators.
- 3. Additional crimes committed in the U.S. by these human rights violators.
- 4. Methods these human rights violators use to enter and remain in the U.S.
- 5. Inter-Agency cooperation to locate and remove these human rights violators.
- 6. Recommendations to strengthen laws to remove these human rights violators.
