A BILL

To block the property of Russian state-owned entities.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Halting Enrichment
5 of Russian Oligarchs and Industry Allies of Moscow's
6 Schemes to Leverage its Abject Villainy Abroad Act of
7 2022" or the "HEROIAM SLAVA Act".

8 SEC. 2. BLOCKING OF PROPERTY OF RUSSIAN STATE-9 OWNED ENTITIES.

(a) IN GENERAL.—On and after the date that is 60
days after the date of the enactment of this Act, the President shall exercise all of the powers granted to the Presi-

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dent under the International Emergency Economic Powers 1 2 Act (50 U.S.C. 1701 et seq.) to the extent necessary to 3 block and prohibit all transactions in property and inter-4 ests in property of any entity the President determines 5 is owned or controlled by the Government of the Russian 6 Federation if such property and interests in property are 7 in the United States, come within the United States, or 8 are or come within the possession or control of a United 9 States person.

10 (b) IMPLEMENTATION; PENALTIES.—

(1) IMPLEMENTATION.—The President may exercise all authorities provided under sections 203
and 205 of the International Emergency Economic
Powers Act (50 U.S.C. 1702 and 1704) to carry out
this section.

16 (2) PENALTIES.—A person that violates, at-17 tempts to violate, conspires to violate, or causes a 18 violation of this section or any regulation, license, or 19 order issued to carry out this section shall be subject 20 to the penalties set forth in subsections (b) and (c) 21 of section 206 of the International Emergency Eco-22 nomic Powers Act (50 U.S.C. 1705) to the same ex-23 tent as a person that commits an unlawful act de-24 scribed in subsection (a) of that section.

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1 (c) EXCEPTION RELATING TO IMPORTATION OF 2 GOODS.—

3 (1) IN GENERAL.—The requirement to block
4 and prohibit all transactions in all property and in5 terests in property under subsection (a) shall not in6 clude the authority or a requirement to impose sanc7 tions on the importation of goods.

8 (2) GOOD.—In this subsection, the term "good" 9 means any article, natural or manmade substance, 10 material, supply or manufactured product, including 11 inspection and test equipment, and excluding tech-12 nical data.

13 (d) UNITED STATES PERSON DEFINED.—In this sec-14 tion, the term "United States person" means—

(1) an individual who is a United States citizen
or an alien lawfully admitted for permanent residence to the United States;

(2) an entity organized under the laws of the
United States or any jurisdiction within the United
States, including a foreign branch of such an entity;
or

(3) any person in the United States.
