Dear Commissioner Bersin:

As you know, I am investigating the connection between the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives (ATF) operation "Fast and Furious" and the firefight on December 14, 2010 that claimed the life of Customs and Border Protection (CBP) Border Patrol Tactical Unit (BORTAC) Agent Brian Terry. Terry's attackers were apparently armed with assault rifles originally purchased as part of ATF's Operation Fast and Furious. The BORTAC unit used thermal binoculars to identify the rifles and demanded that the suspected aliens drop their weapons. Yet, according to an affidavit filed by the FBI, even after the aliens refused to disarm themselves, the BORTAC unit was under standing orders to first use non-lethal bean bag rounds.¹ The aliens responded with gunfire, and Agent Terry was killed in the ensuing exchange.

It's difficult to understand why CBP would require its agents to use less-than-lethal force against people who are clearly armed and dangerous. Further, Agent Brian Terry's brother, Kent Terry, has said that of the four individuals in the BORTAC unit, only two were armed with standard firearms at all. Two carried *only* bean bag guns. These agents did not even have the means to defend themselves.

Please provide copies of all records relating to:

- (1) CBP's policy on the use of force in circumstances such as those Brian Terry reportedly faced, and
- (2) Any change to that policy in the last two years.

Affidavit

I am a Special Agent (SA) of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI). I have been a Special Agent since January 1999. I am currently assigned to a Violent Crime squad, with the majority of my cases being on the Indian Reservation investigations.

The statements contained in this affidavit are based on information provided by employees of the FBI and other law enforcement agencies, and on my experience and background as a Special Agent of the FBI. I have not included each and every fact known to me concerning this investigation.

On 12/14/2010, at approximately 11:15 pm, four United States Border Patrol Agents attempted to apprehend at least five suspected illegal aliens in Peck Canyon, which is located in Rio Rico, Arizona. One of the Border Patrol Agents, utilizing thermal binoculars, observed at least two of the suspected aliens carrying rifles. When the group of suspected aliens was near the Border Patrol Agents' location, at least one Border Patrol Agent identified himself as police and ordered the suspected aliens to drop their weapons. When the suspected aliens did not drop their weapons, two Border Patrol Agents deployed "less than lethal" bean bags at the suspected aliens. At this time, at least one of the suspected aliens fired at the Border Patrol Agents. Two Border Patrol Agents returned fire, one with his long gun, and one with his pistol.

Border Patrol Agent Brian Terry was shot with one bullet, and died shortly after. One of the suspected illegal aliens, later identified as Manuel Osorio-Arellanes, was also shot. On 12/16/2010, Osorio-Arellanes was interviewed by FBI Agents. Osorio-Arellanes was read his Miranda rights before he was interviewed, and agreed to talk to the FBI Agents without an attorney preset. Osorio-Arellanes stated that he was traveling with four individuals. All of the individuals were armed, to include Osorio-Arellanes. Osorio-Arellanes stated that he had raised his weapon towards the Border Patrol Agents, but he did not fire because he had realized that they were Border Patrol Agents. At this time, he was shot.

Some of the evidence collected at the shooting crime scene included five backpacks, three gloves, two sweatshirts, a pullover, a jacket, a knit hat, a baseball cap, and a razor. The FBI Laboratory will conduct trace examinations for hairs and fibers on these items. The trace examiners need known hairs to compare to any unknown hairs that may be found on these items. Head hairs taken from Osorio-Arellanes are necessary to compare with any hairs that may be found on the clothing items.
