A BILL

To require the Administrator of the Economic Research Service to conduct research on consolidation and concentration in the livestock industry, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Livestock Consolida-
5 tion Research Act of 2026”.

6 **SEC. 2. LIVESTOCK CONSOLIDATION RESEARCH.**

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 1 year after the
8 date on which each latest Census of Agriculture is made
9 publicly available, the Administrator of the Economic Re-

1 search Service shall publish a report on consolidation and
2 concentration in the livestock industry, including—

3 (1) changes in the size and location of ranches,
4 farms, processing facilities, and packers throughout
5 the United States; and

6 (2) the impact of the changes described in para-
7 graph (1) on farmers, ranchers, and downstream
8 consumers, including—

9 (A) financial impacts;

10 (B) market entry impacts;

11 (C) access to resources and inputs, includ-
12 ing processing facilities; and

13 (D) dietary impacts.

14 (b) SOURCES OF INFORMATION.—In preparing a re-
15 port under subsection (a), the Administrator of the Eco-
16 nomic Research Service shall draw on data available to
17 the Secretary of Agriculture, including the Census of Agri-
18 culture, inspection records of the Food Safety and Inspec-
19 tion Service, and the packing plant data of the Packers
20 and Stockyards Division of the Agricultural Marketing
21 Service.

22 (c) REPORT ORGANIZATION.—The report under sub-
23 section (a) shall separate information on beef cattle by
24 cow-calf and fed cattle operations.

1 (d) CONFIDENTIALITY.—A report published under
2 subsection (a) shall not contain any confidential business
3 information.

4 (e) DEFINITION OF LIVESTOCK.—In this section, the
5 term “livestock” includes beef, dairy, pork, and poultry
6 production (including broilers, eggs, and turkeys).
