Roundup: Comprehensive Addiction Recovery Act

Senate Judiciary Committee Chairman Chuck Grassley led the bipartisan [Comprehensive Addiction Recovery Act](#) to final passage in the Senate after moving the bill through the Judiciary Committee without opposition. Here's what people are saying about the bipartisan accomplishment.

"This landmark legislation, a comprehensive response to the devastating impact of opioid and other drug abuse in Iowa and the rest of the nation, would leverage health care, law enforcement, and substance abuse prevention and treatment services to reverse current trends. ... This positive action is due in large part to the leadership and input of Iowa Senator Charles Grassley, who held a hearing on the bill in the Senate Judiciary Committee he chairs before managing it on the Senate floor. He also worked to ensure the bill addresses needs in rural areas as well as methamphetamine abuse issues, in addition to the growing abuse of opioids, all of which are challenges we face in Iowa."
